Introduction

The Air Force Academy Libraries are pleased to produce this Fifth Supplement to the *United States Airforce Academy: A Bibliography 1954- 1964*. This supplement includes materials published between 1 January 1990 and 31 December 1995. It updates the original bibliography and previous supplements which covered the periods of 1954 - 1964, 1964 - 1967, 1968 - 1971, 1972 - 1982, and 1983 - 1989, respectively.

This bibliography does not include articles from local-area (Colorado Springs and Denver) newspapers. Reports of specific athletic events are also excluded, regardless of the source. Even though recent Academy Assemblies, Harmon Memorial Lectures, and Military History Symposia are part of this compilation, a number of materials published at the Academy are not included. Finally, a few items are cited which pre-date the years covered by this supplement. Such items were discovered by the current bibliographer as having been omitted from the previous editions.

The basic arrangement is by subject as set forth in the Table of Contents. Within each subject area, the listing is subdivided by resource type: Air Force Instructions (AFIs), books, newspaper and periodical articles, government documents, and other sources. Call numbers, shown in parentheses, indicate the location of the item in the Academy libraries.
